What is a Miami-Dade NOA?

The Miami-Dade Notice of Acceptance is a document issued by the Miami-Dade County Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources - Product Control Section. It signifies that a particular product or material has passed stringent testing requirements and is approved for use in construction projects within Miami-Dade County and other areas following the High-Velocity Hurricane Zone (HVHZ) building code. This testing ensures that products and materials can withstand the severe weather conditions that are commonly experienced in South Florida and other parts of the country.

What Rainier products are covered under the Miami Dade NOA?

Intertek testing facility in West Palm Beach Florida tested two Rainier retractable awning models: an **Olympus**, and a **Summit** unit. Both Rainier awnings were tested at 3 different speeds, 47 mph, 61 mph and the record setting 94 mph for a duration of 1 minute each. Both Rainier awnings passed the testing phase without withstanding any structural damage.
